

Carnegie Mellon University is in **Pittsburgh**, a mid-sized city in Southwestern Pennsylvania. Nestled between 450-acre Schenley Park, the University of Pittsburgh, and the charming Craig Street shopping district, CMU is within easy walking distance of spectacular cultural resources, including the Carnegie Museum of Art 1, the Carnegie Museum of Natural History 2, the Carnegie Library 3, and Phipps Botanical Gardens 4.

A short bus ride away is the thriving arts scene of Downtown Pittsburgh ③, including the Mellon Arena stadium ⑥. Just across the Allegheny river are other major attractions such as the Warhol Museum ⑦, the Mattress Factory ③, the Children's Museum ④, the Pittsburgh Aviary ⑩, the Carnegie Science Center ⑪, and, for sports fans, Heinz Field and PNC Park stadium ⑫!

Carnegie Mellon is a multi-disciplinary research university comprised of seven colleges and numerous research institutes — a home to more than 5000 undergraduates in 80 baccalaureate degree programs, 2500 graduate students, 3000 staff, and 1000 faculty. Carnegie Mellon University is:

In a comprehensive **college** of studio & performing **arts**...

The **College of Fine Arts** (CFA) at Carnegie Mellon brings together five internationallyrenowned departments: the Schools of Art, Design, Architecture, Drama and Music.

In addition to the **BFA** (Bachelor of Fine Arts) and 5-year **BArch** (Bachelor of Architecture) degrees, the College also offers three special interdisciplinary degrees: the **BHA** (Bachelor of Humanities and Arts); the **BSA** (Bachelor of Science and Arts), and the **BCSA** (Bachelor of Computer Science and Arts). These programs allow for integrated double-majors in the student's choice of undergraduate concentration areas.

For graduate students, the various CFA Schools also offer programs leading to the **MFA**, **MDes**, **MArch**, and **MMus** degrees.

The **CMU School of Art** considers, in practical and visionary terms, the role of art and the artist in society. Combining the advantages of an innovative professional studio program with the interdisciplinary resources of a top-tier university, we encourage experimentation, crossing boundaries, and hybrid processes while engaging the history and traditions of art. The Carnegie Mellon School of Art:

- Offers concentrations in 2D, 3D, and 4D artforms alongside thematic "concept" studios;
- Has 180 undergraduates, nearly 50% of whom pursue some form of interdisciplinary degree;
- Has an 18-student, 3-year MFA program that is ranked #1 for multimedia and #7 overall by US News & World Report's 2008 Best Graduate Schools.
